Corvette Love Affair - 58 Years and Counting

February 14th is Valentine's Day. What better month to reflect the history of the Corvette series, the main focus and center point of CMCS.

The sixth series is now into its 6th year. Our members own examples of all six series, some of which show on this month's cover.

CMCS came into being in 1963, ten years after the first Corvette came off the line. We had a CMCS 40th Anniversary Party in August 2003, one of the nicest events held in several years.

Time to start planning for the 60th anniversary of Corvette and 50th anniversary of CMCS. 2013 is a non SIS year, so we can have a big bash for the club in or around September 2013.

For count, 126 of our present members were members in 2003. So less than half the present CMCS members have been to an anniversary bash. Don't miss it. Get your renewal form in, and think about what you would like to do for 2013 to recognize this milestone.



As we head into the waning days of winter we look eagerly toward our first event of the new year. The Wet Weekend team informs us that we have over thirty cars going to Coupeville. I understand that there is still opportunity for others to join in.

Great job Armstrongs and Wagners!

Although winter is understandably a slow time for CMCS in terms of events, your Board of Directors has not been idle. We've been working on some amendments to the Bylaws which should bring them up-to-date with long standing policies, and will streamline our voting process.

Of significant change is a proposed amendment on voting for approval of amendments. As it currently stands an amendment can be voted on only at a meeting where we have in attendance a quorum consisting of one-fourth of the members. With a club of our size that can sometimes be difficult to attain. Therefore, we are asking you to approve an amendment that will allow for voting by

proxy, whereby the proxy votes will be added to the attending members at the meeting where voting will take place. The proxy votes should allow us the quorum necessary to vote. There are two complementary amendments: 1) to change the designated quorum from members at a specific meeting needing a quarter of the full members, to a quarter of the current full members without reference to a specific meeting; 2) to allow for proxy votes to be added per my above explanation. The actual proposed amendments and the reasons for them will be found elsewhere in this issue of *On Your Marque*.

As it stands, these amendments can be voted on only at a meeting where we have a quorum in attendance, so as soon as we meet that standard we can vote on them.

Of course, there will be discussion before voting on the amendments.

Please give these your careful attention, and plan on coming out to our March 12 general meeting, which will be our Installation Banquet for next year's Board of Directors. It will be held at Shawn O'Donnell's. If we have a quorum we will be voting on the amendments at that time.

I'd like to extend my personal congratulations to Jack Goodman and Claudia Simmons, for being selected by the Board of Directors as our honorees for the month of February. Jack and Claudia have been faithful members since 2000, and have lent their help to a variety of causes. For the past few years they have handled the 50/50 raffle at our general meetings. You can read more about them elsewhere in this issue of OYM.

If you've had your car garaged for the past few months, as have I, it will soon be time to get it ready for the driving season. I suggest you plan on taking it in to our sponsors, Lee Johnson or Speedway Chevrolet, for the necessary service. If you need parts or repairs, be sure to ask them for the CMCS club discount.

That's it for this issue.



Pre-Printed Membership Renewal Forms

Your membership renewals are due on or before March 31st.

The form has a new addition this year. Look for your disclosure consent status. The form also has provisions to allow you to easily revise your existing consent status, or file an initial disclosure consent if you have not yet done so.

Please Read

NOTICE! The renewal forms returned to date have a major misunderstanding on disclosure consent. Several have been returned with **only** a check in the box for "I will manage ONLINE display myself". No indications were made for the printed directory. Remember, the online and printed systems are TOTALLY INDEPENDENT, and have NO synchronization or comparison of data. They are managed in different systems by different administrators.

If you change your personal information on the renewal form, the changes will be made independently in both the online system and the official club membership database by the club administrator for each system, unless you have checked the "I will manage ONLINE display myself" box. In this case the official database will be changed, but the online information will not. You must then change it online yourself.

If you <u>do not</u> make choices for the printed directory on the form (several have left it blank, evidently thinking that online and printed are the same), only your name and Corvette will appear in the printed booklet, regardless of what you do or request for the online portion, including "Managing it yourself".

Editor's Note: Having two independent membership information systems has turned out to be troublesome and an administrative confusion for all.

For 2011 we will work to make changes to the system to have a single source for data entry, and to have the 2nd source either terminated or synchronized to mirror the information in the single source. Hang in there with us and stay tuned.

On the back are more information on disclosure consent and a survey. The survey gives you an opportunity to convey to the Board what you would like to see changed, added or discontinued in Club operations.

You can really help the membership and database chairpersons by doing the following:

- Mark changes and mail it to CMCS with your check now, before you
 forget, or lose the pre-printed form. Waiting until the last minute makes it
 harder for everyone.
- PLEASE use the pre-printed form. It makes it much easier for membership
 chairs to see your markups, and is more accurate. We must have the form
 for tracking, even if there are no changes.

Laps From the Past or "Marque in Time" A CMCS history feature by Ben Benninghoff



40 LAPS AGO: February '71. President Frank Olsheski gets the monthly meeting started during the Wet Weekend outing to the Beachwood Resort at Copalis Beach, Washington. Frank also presents the previous minutes as the secretary was home playing new mother. Don Schwab presented the treasurer's report, indicating the present level of club funds were quite low due to member's funds not yet received to attend the Wet Weekend

festivities. Don also went over how the membership would be handled and passed out forms to be filled out to bring the club's

records up to date. John Thomas reported that the Annual Awards Banquet would be held at the Fog Cutter next month on the 13th, and the phone committee will contact the members concerning their choice of dinners. Jeff Weymouth talked about the Mission Ridge Ski weekend in April to coincide with Spring Break. WWSCC Autocross Standards for '71 are available, see Ron McDuffie. Frank showed several new publications from Corvette clubs that closely parallel "On Your Marque" on set-up, but not content. Frank reminded the committee chairman their end of year report were due. The Schwab's, Thomas's, & Kelly's were thanked by all for the great meal everyone had this evening. The annual report for non-profit corporations has been notarized and filed with the Secretary of State. New member Tim Howard was voted into full membership (no mention of the total membership number-Ben) and Frank reviewed the club's election nomination procedure for the new board officers election process, presenting the board's recommendations, then opening it up to all from the general membership present for additional names for consideration. Jay & Jan Cockrum will buy & sell t-shirts on their own. All members were asked to attend the events meeting to give any inputs and so committees groups can be formed. Parking and Practice Sessions were also scheduled for this coming summer. Bruce read the Board's recommendations for officer nominations for the

coming elections, and then opened to all for additional names placed into consideration. Results will be announced at the next general membership meeting. If the club wishes to return to the Beachwood Resort next year for the annual Wet Weekend, the resort wants a two night reservation commitment rather than the one night as is presently reserved. CMCS Proposed Bylaws Amendments

ARTICLE XIII - AMENDMENTS

Section II: Quorum

At said meeting of the members, a quorum shall be one fourth of the full members of **The Club**. (Replace with):

A quorum for the purpose of voting on Amendments shall be one-fourth of the Full Members of *The Club*.

Reason: A guorum may be required at other times than any specific (said) meeting.

Section III: Ratification

These Bylaws as amended shall become effective when ratified by a two thirds vote of the attending full membership at said meeting. (Replace with):

Voting shall be by Full Members present at a meeting of the general membership held after publishing of the proposed Amendments. Full Members who do not attend said meeting may vote by proxy through written notice of their vote choice given to any member of the Board of Directors prior to the general membership meetings at which votes will be taken. Proxy votes may be given by hand delivery, U.S. Postal Service, or e-mail. Proxy voters will be added to the number of Full Members in attendance at said meeting to be considered part of the quorum. Proxy voters may designate that the Board Member to whom the proxy is granted must vote according to the choice(s) of the voter granting the proxy. Proxies are valid only for the issues specified in the proxy. Each Full Member is entitled to one vote. These Bylaws as amended shall become effective when ratified by a two-thirds majority of all Full Members present at said General Meeting and proxy ballots combined.

Reason: Because quorums are difficult to attain at meetings it is necessary to facilitate voting on amendments at times other than when membership is at low ebb. Also, it is expedient that we allow Full Members to vote by proxy so that they may have their voices heard if they wish. We considered using only mail-in ballots, but that would present some problems other than hampering discussion of the proposed amendments: 1) The cost and labor to mail and receive, then count the ballots, would be wasted if a quorum of Full Members did not vote. That would necessitate another mailing of the ballots and another recount, who knows how many times until a quorum has responded. Unless a quorum is met, any proposed amendment is still in the proposal state; it is not automatically discarded. Thus it would have to be resubmitted until that quorum has been met. By adding proxy ballots to the ballots at the meeting, those members voting by proxy would be part of the quorum under this new amendment."
