Cover Car - Alton & Aldene Loe's 2009 Coupe



This is our second Corvette. The first was a 2000 Millennium Yellow Coupe purchased new in 2000. When the car was 10 years old we decided to trade up to a C6.

Joe Harvey at Speedway Chevrolet in Monroe tracked this car down for us. The new C6 is Crystal Red Metallic with Z51 package, dual roofs and 4LT leather kit. Our C6 had been

sitting on the showroom floor of a dealer in Massachusetts for 583 days. Joe had it loaded on a transport and we had it a week later.



We recently added an insulation package to our C6. The floor of the passenger compartment got pretty hot and there was a lot of road noise. A layer of insulation under the carpet from the firewall back to the rear hatch reduced the heat inside the car and made it easier to have a conversation. Now that it is quieter, we are putting on a Billy Boat Fusion exhaust with the mild to wild switch so we can hear the engine when we want to. Our Corvette will sound less like a sewing machine and more like the sports car it is.

We are new members, but have been to several events over the last few years. We took part in a XXX Corvette Show, a Salmon Days parade and Alton taught at the Driving School several years ago. Alton got his track experience with the BMW school driving non-BMW cars and passing the BMW drivers around the track in the 2000 Coupe.

We are looking forward to getting to know all of you and to doing lots more events with CMCS.



School Daze 2011 - Event Report

Another successful School Daze is in the record books. This year we had seventy one participants of which there were eighteen instructors. The need for instructors was great because again we had a large turnout in our beginner class which consisted of drivers who had little or no time on the road course at Pacific Raceways. We promise them an instructor

in the passenger seat and we delivered.

This year we held our School Daze ground school at the Speedware shop in Renton. They also supplied refreshments. As a result we held our Ground School on July 14th at the Speedware shop in Redmond. There Ryan Schwab presented detailed information about the intricacies of Pacific Raceway's road course. He covered the course itself, braking zones, the corners, equipment requirements, the schedule of the event, what to expect, as well as the rules of the event. Speedware staff were on hand to provide refreshments and to answer questions about the shop services and products they offer.

On July 21st the School Daze Team set up the road course at Pacific Raceways and welcomed the drivers who participated in the event. There were mostly Corvettes in attendance, but we did have a few Porsches, an occasional BMW, a couple Camaros and Mustangs, a beautiful Audi R8, and a couple Mazda Miatas that were modified for the track. Each driver there with their car to learn more about how well it handled.

We have four "Run Groups" as we call them. They are A, B, C, D with the beginners in group D. These are people who have no previous Pacific Raceway or track experience. Group D tends to learn the most during the day. They are paired up with an instructor who works with them to learn the handling characteristics of the car and the demands of the road course. In "Track Language" the instructor teaches about the braking zone, the turn in area of a corner, the exit of a corner, the apex, and the acceleration zone of a corner. The drivers in Group D tend to learn a lot during their experience.

We offer Group C, Advanced Beginner, for those who have some previous track experience and place an instructor with these drivers so they can improve on their experience and driving skills. Group B is our intermediate group who have improved their skills through experience on Pacific Raceways or other road courses to a point where they are competent drivers at speed and continue to work at honing

their skills. Group A is our advance driver group who have extensive track experience and participate in track events regularly. These people I will call "Track Junkies." Many of our Group A drivers also have excelled to become instructors who help others to enjoy the track experience.

This year we started the day with some cloudy conditions and light rain. Learning how your Corvette handles in the rain is a very learning experience. Off and on during the morning we had a cloud that would drift over us and leave some moisture behind. This caused us to slow the participants down, much as you would driving on I-5 during rain. The afternoon proved to be much nicer weather so the track dried out and participants were able to experience dry track conditions.

School Daze is a great experience for those who participate and it is possible because of the tireless work on the part of the School Daze Team who include Ryan Schwab, Don Schwab, Tim Cox, Mona Cox, Gary Main, Ron McDuffie, John Thomas, Tom Pritchett, Bob Rothwell, Scott Main, Mark VerMurlen, Lyal Schlotterbeck, Larry Webb, and other volunteers who help us to make this event a success. There have also been numerous other people who have helped over the years. Thanks to all who helped make this event so successful.
