CORVETTES FEATURED AT 2016 VINTAGE RACES

The best vintage racing of the season takes place during the Pacific Northwest Historics around the July 4 holiday (Pacific Raceways track). Screaming Ferraris, thundering Corvettes and Cobras, formula cars and lots of British iron. We can all find multiple cars to like. The paddock is open to all spectators so you can view the cars up close and visit with the drivers, many of whom travel long distances to make this race. You can cross the track and view the action in the S curves on the back side of the track as well as from the grandstands.

Car Corral participation is for PRE-REGISTERED cars ONLY. There are no exceptions. If you don't have a car corral pass, you will be turned away.

Cost is \$30 for the car corral pass, which includes driver-spectator admission. Additional adult spectator admission is \$25 each, children 7-16 are \$5 each, and children under 7 are free.

Deadline for receipt of your request & deposit check is Saturday, May 14.

This year, **Corvette is the featured marque** so they are expecting several Corvette clubs to participate in the car corral.

That weekend, I will be compiling all of the requests and mailing in our joint request to SOVREN. I should add that SOVREN does not issue refunds for cancellations. Then a couple weeks before the event, I will be mailing you the car corral pass and the spectator admission tickets. Should it be raining and you decide the morning of the event not to drive your Corvette, you can always come with your daily driver and park in the normal lot, as your spectator admission tickets are good regardless.

Laps from the Past

50 LAPS AGO: May '66. The monthly meeting took place at the Hyatt House where President John R. Thomas called the meeting to order. John then introduced the guest in attendance. The Treasurer noted that Club funds were low, but the Club had received funds from sponsor Alan Green Chevrolet towards the Autocross insurance and for publishing costs for the monthly newsletter. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved without any modifications. Ron and Libby White volunteered to maintain the Club bulletin board at Club sponsor Alan

Green Chevrolet. They asked for color pictures of Club events and members to post on the board. Frank Olsheski and Gerry Patten were both voted into full membership by those in attendance. Bob Morse gave a quick rundown on the Club's 7th Autocross scheduled for later in the month. Discussions took place concerning creating a form letter to be given out to prospective Corvette owners

at Alan Green with information how they could join the Club. The N.G.T. and Tyeer Triumph clubs were invited to attend an upcoming Club meeting. It was suggested that we acquire trophies, plaques, or something else that would be appropriate to be given to any visiting club as a thank you for attending a Club function. The Activities Chair reminded all about the upcoming Tune-up Session in June at Alan Green Chevrolet, and the Dam Tour in July.

40 LAPS AGO: May '76. President Dale Ellis opened the monthly meeting at the Buccaneer Restaurant. Membership introduced prospective members Steve & Linda Turner, Tex Howick, were all voted into full membership with Michelle Phelps joining as an affiliate member. Former members Dave & Sandy Richards rejoined the Club bringing the total membership to 107. Activities saw a tour to Yakima Sun for the weekend that left from Issaquah Zips and met up with other Corvettes in North Bend. A Concours & Autocross took place in Bremerton. Rick explained what WWSCC (Western Washington Sports Car Council) was to all in attendance. Rick committed to get an equipment list compiled for all clubs to use. Kevin explained what NWACC (NorthWest Association of Corvette Clubs) was, and noted new rulebooks would be available for \$2.50 from the Millens. NWACC was in the process of creating their own newsletter; watch the May issue of Vette Views for a full page ad on NWACC. Len Hodges talked about the Club's last 2 Parking Sessions and thanked all who helped. Dale discussed possible designs for wall plaques, trophies, and dash plaques. Dee McDuffie had club rosters to hand out.

30 LAPS AGO: May '86. President Frank Brese presided at the monthly meeting at Shakey's in Totem Lake. NCRS (National Corvette Restorer's Society) held their annual picnic at Lake Sammamish. They also scheduled a Regional Meet in Bend Oregon in June, with their National Convention set for Reno in July. Rose Eckenberg was voted into full membership bringing the total to 88. Other Club activities were participation in the Montlake Terrace Community Fair Days Parade. Anchorage Alaska Corvettes were hosting a raffle for a 1962 Corvette; tickets were \$5/each or 4 for \$20 with proceeds benefiting the American Heart Association. Tickets could be purchased from Club member Byron Crocker. The Club's annual Christmas Party was scheduled to take place at the Windjammer.

20 LAPS AGO: May '96. In making an exception of providing a picture of a Club member's Corvette on the newsletter cover, editor Cloyd Jackson provided a black and white picture of Zora Arkus-Duntov seated in his Sebring SS Corvette. Zora passed away on April 21st and was thought of by many as the father of the Corvette. The Board of Officers was to review the proposed changes/update then present the final draft to the membership for approval; the membership thanked the ladies for a job well done that needed doing for years.
